SIGHTINGS

MID-NOVEMBER TO EARLY DECEMBER 2008

"Sightings" appears monthly, alternating between Winging It and Birding, with the latest news, reports, and rumors from the ABA Area and Mexico. Sightings are compiled from online discussion groups and RBAs, with valuable contributions from a growing network of informants continent-wide. Readers should note, however, that none of these reports has yet been vetted by a records committee. All birders are urged to submit documentation of rare sightings to the appropriate state or provincial committees. Summary: Snowy Owls and Whitewinged Crossbills continue to move south in large numbers in the North-Central, Northeast, and Mid-Atlantic regions. The annual northeastern Cave Swallow flight was impressive this November, with some as far north as Newfoundland and some lingering into December in the Mid-Atlantic region. The period's mega-rarity was a Sungrebe at Bosque del Apache National Wildlife Refuge, NM. Questions of provenance were raised and reasonable cases can be made for both a wild and captive origin. Evidence does seem to favor a wild origin, however. If accepted, the Sungrebe would be the first ABA record. At least eight states and provinces garnered first records this period.

Southeast: A Great Cormorant has been present inland on the GA/AL state line since 11/17. It represents the 1st inland record for AL and the 2nd inland for GA. A Northern Goshawk was in Shelby, TN 11/29. A 1st-cycle Iceland Gull was found in Marshall, AL 11/22-23, representing the state's 9th record. A Buff-bellied Hummingbird frequented a feeder in Brevard, FL 11/24-12/2. Last month's Cassin's Kingbird was re-found 11/15 in Hendry, FL, and a Fork-tailed Flycatcher was at Pelican Island NWR, Indian River, FL 11/25-12/3. Alabama's 2nd Varied Thrush was on Dauphin Island, Mobile, AL 11/16-20; the state's 1st was in 1992. A Hooded Oriole was

photographed in *McCracken*, KY 11/24, the state's 1st if accepted. A Clay-colored Sparrow was in *Cumberland*, TN 11/29. A Rusty Blackbird was observed s. of its normal winter range in Everglades NP, *Miami-Dade*, FL 11/14–15.

Mid-Atlantic: Cave Swallows staged an impressive invasion into the region. More than 100 were in *Cape May*, NJ 11/11–12 and nearly 200 were there 11/16 including 120 at a roost. Several dead birds were salvaged as specimens the following morning. To date, all fall

11/26. A Franklin's Gull was observed in *Wicomico*, MD 11/23. At least 10 Snowy Owls were noted on Long Island, NY in late November with others in NJ, PA, and MD. A Ruby-throated Hummingbird, very rare in late fall, was present in *Cape May*, NJ through 11/23 and an Ash-throated Flycatcher was present there 11/27–12/2. Whitewinged Crossbills were reported as far south as PA, NJ, and MD.

Northeast: Snowy Owls and Whitewinged Crossbills continue to occur in impressive numbers throughout the re-

specimens in the Northeast represent southwestern *pallida* Cave Swallows, not nominate *fulva* from the Caribbean. A Black-bellied Whistling-Duck was in *Sussex*, DE 11/23–26 and a Barnacle Goose was in *Hunterdon*, NJ 11/27 through mid-Dec. A Gyrfalcon was caught at the Little Gap Raptor Banding Station in *Northampton*, PA

gion. One noteworthy record was a single-day tally of more than 20 Snowy Owls near Cape Race, NL 11/15. An astounding flight of 1,785 White-winged Crossbills was counted in 2½ hours on the Lake Ontario shore in *Monroe*, NY 11/24. The annual Cave Swallow invasion was not limited to the Mid-Atlantic this fall. Of note was a Cave

Swallow in Newfoundland 11/13-15, the northeastern-most record ever of this species. PEI also received its 1st provincial record 11/14-15, and more than a dozen were reported from coastal NB. Barnacle Geese were present in CT, MA, and ME. A Northern Lapwing was in Portugal Cove South, NL 11/29-12/6 for the 2nd consecutive year. As expected in late fall, larids put on a good show. A 1st-cycle Franklin's Gull, seen less than annually in the province, was at St. John's, NL 11/28-12/7. A "Common" Mew Gull was observed at Corner Brook, NL 11/28 and 2 lingered all month at St. John's. Another "Common" Mew Gull was photographed in Cumberland, ME 12/10, for the state's 2nd record and 1st documented with a photo. A Yellow-legged Gull lingered at St. John's, NL. A Slaty-backed Gull at Corner Brook, NL 12/1-2 was either the 9th or 10th record since the province's 1st in 2005. Another Slatybacked Gull was photographed 11/28-12/1 in Hartford, CT. If accepted, it would be a 1st state record. A White-winged Dove was in its 2nd month in Cumberland, ME. The Broad-billed Hummingbird and Mountain Bluebird continue on Cape Cod, MA. A Calliope Hummingbird, CT's 2nd, was at a feeder 11/19 in Hartford. Apparently, it had been present since mid-October and continues as of 12/8. A Black-headed Grosbeak was in Washington, RI 12/7-8.

South-Central: A Red-throated Loon was observed in *Cleveland*, OK 12/2–7. A Purple Sandpiper was on South Padre Island, *Cameron*, TX 11/29. A disputed gull was photographed and tentatively identified as a Kelp Gull in *Brazoria*, TX 11/8–23; some experts raised the possibility that it could be a hybrid. A female Broad-billed Hummingbird, AR's 2nd, was photographed

in Faulkner 11/22-24. A Dusky-capped Flycatcher, reported in last month's "Sightings," continued at Sabal Palm Grove Sanctuary, Cameron, TX at least through 12/1. The imm. male Rose-throated Becard remained at Estero Llano Grande SP, Hidalgo, TX for most of November, while another imm. male was seen 12/7 at Salineño, Starr, TX. A Blue Bunting was found in Hidalgo, TX 12/6-9.

North-Central: Two Brant were in Cerro Gordo, IA 11/20-27. A Barrow's Goldeneye, IA's 11th, was seen in Woodbury 11/16-17 and a 2nd bird was seen in Marion, IA through 12/1. Another Barrow's Goldeneye was seen in Hughes, SD 11/16-17. This is SD's 6th Barrow's away from Rapid City, where it is a more regular winter visitor. A Northern Gannet was seen at Grimsby, ON 11/9. An American Avocet lingered through 12/4 in Pickering, ON. Snowy Owls were widely reported. MO's 1st Allen's Hummingbird, an imm., was banded 11/27 and remained through 12/4 in St. Louis. Northern Shrikes are staging an invasion throughout MO for the 2nd consecutive year, with at least 7 birds observed this fall. Single male and female Varied Thrushes visited feeders in St. Louis, MN 11/30-12/11. A Black-throated Gray Warbler remained until 12/4 in Rondeau Provincial Park, ON. A male Northern Cardinal was in Cass, ND 11/29-12/1. A Spotted Towhee, originally spotted 11/11 at Point Pelee, ON was re-found 12/7.

Southwest: The highlight this period was a **Sungrebe**, a 1st U.S. record, found at Bosque del Apache NWR, *So*-

corro, NM. Originally found 11/13, it was not identified correctly until 11/17, and it stayed only through the 18th. A Red-throated Loon in Cochise, AZ 12/8 was one of very few ever recorded in the state. A Yellow-billed Loon was in Park, CO 10/28-11/16. A light-morph Short-tailed Hawk returned to Tucson for a 2nd winter 11/20. A Gyrfalcon was observed in Park, CO 11/10. The returning Northern Jacana was in Pinal through the period. An Ancient Murrelet was seen 11/17 in Pueblo, CO. Colorado also hosted a probable Common Ground-Dove in Bent 12/2 and an Anna's Hummingbird in Larimer 11/5. A Northern Shrike was photographed at Mormon Lake, AZ 11/16. A White-eyed Vireo was in Santa Cruz, CA 12/3; nearly as rare seasonally, single Bell's Vireos were in Maricopa, AZ 11/29 and Mohave, AZ 12/8. The Patagonia, AZ Sinaloa Wren was still present 12/6. Single Rufousbacked Robins appeared at 2 Santa Cruz, AZ sites 12/4 and 12/6. Rare warblers in s. AZ included a Tennessee in Maricopa 12/3-4, a Yellow-throated in Pinal through 11/16, a Magnolia in Cochise 11/15 and a Black-throated Green in Tucson through 12/10. An

adult male Orchard Oriole returned to *Maricopa* for a 3rd winter while another was discovered in Tucson 12/10.

West Coast and Northwest: A Whooper Swan has frequented Gooding, ID since 11/26. A Barrow's Goldeneye 11/28 was a county 1st and the 500th species for Los Angeles, CA. The Yellowbilled Loon found 11/8 in Bodega Bay, Sonoma, CA was still present. A Rednecked Grebe was a 1st for Stanislaus, CA 11/15. The Laysan Albatross returned 11/22 to Point Arena Cove, Mendocino, CA for at least its 16th year. A Greater Shearwater was photographed in Monterey Bay, CA 11/29 and 2 Manx Shearwaters were observed offshore at Cordell Bank, CA 11/17. A Brown Booby was seen in San Diego, CA 11/9 and 2 Neotropic Cormorants were present through 11/28 in Imperial, CA. Two Ruffs were noted in Coos, OR on 11/8 and 11/30. British Columbia's 1st confirmed Black-tailed Gull was seen on and off at Vancouver Island 11/18-12/1. There are 2 previous sight records for the province. A Lesser Black-backed Gull in Lake, CA 11/1-15 was a county 1st, while another was in Orange, CA. San Luis Obispo's 1st Broad-billed Hummingbird, discovered

10/31 remained into November. A Costa's Hummingbird was in Creston, BC 11/17-12/1. This was BC's 20th record, but only the 3rd outside the "normal" spring window of occurrence. A Dusky-capped Flycatcher was a 1st for San Bernardino, CA 11/17. This bird has lingered into December. San Luis Obispo, CA hosted single Gray Catbird and Blue-headed

Vireo during the period. Single Redthroated Pipits were seen in *Monterey* 11/12 and *San Diego*, CA 11/14. A Prairie Warbler, British Columbia's 5th, was near Kamloops 11/16–19. Farther south, a Cape May Warbler was in *Santa Cruz*, CA and several Worm-eating Warblers were noted in *Ventura*, *Riverside*, and *San Diego*, CA in November. Two Scarlet Tanagers were reported in southern California, 1 in *San Diego* through 12/9 and another in *Orange* in early December. Finally, Oregon's 1st Pyrrhuloxia continues to visit a feeder in *Linn*. It has been present since 11/11.

Mexico: A Zone-tailed Hawk and Summer Tanager were photographed near Pescaderos, Baja California 11/14 where a Harlan's Hawk was also present. Three Glaucous-winged Gulls were observed at the Mexicali dump, Baia California on the same day. Two Common Murres were noted offshore at Coronado Canyon, Baja California 11/22. An Olivaceous Woodcreeper was observed above Cola de Caballo, Nuevo León 12/3, which is north of its known range. Finally, a Brown Thrasher was observed and photographed in Tecate, Baja California 11/24-12/1, a 1st for the state.
